



<p><b>Language Proficiency Level</b></p>	<p>A Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) N2 level or equivalent proficiency on another recognized Japanese language test is generally required. If the student does not have any official language test certificates, a letter from a professor at the student's home university confirming their proficiency is also acceptable. If neither of the above is available, please contact CAT for further guidance.</p>																		
<p><b>Nomination</b></p>	<p>First, the student must be nominated by their home university. For the nomination, the person in charge at the home university must complete and submit the required information in the Nomination Form (Google Form) received from CAT.</p> <p><b>Nomination Deadline</b>          2027 Spring : <b>September 30th, 2025</b> for the enrollment in April, 2027          2027 Fall : <b>March 31st, 2026</b> for the enrollment in October, 2027</p>																		
<p><b>Interview</b></p>	<p>An interview may be conducted with the students after their nomination.</p>																		
<p><b>Application Process</b></p>	<p>After receiving the nomination, CAT will send the following application materials (01 to 03) to the student's home institution's coordinator by email. The students will need to complete these materials. Additionally, students must prepare the remaining documents (04 to 09) on their own. <b>Visa Procedures</b>	<p>After your acceptance has been confirmed, we will send the following two original documents. Once you receive them, please apply for a Student Visa at the Embassy or Consulate of Japan in your home country. <a href="#">COE</a></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Certificate of Eligibility (COE)</li> <li>● Letter of Admission</li> </ul>
<b>Orientation</b>	<p>Orientation will be held within one week of your arrival. During the orientation, we will provide important information regarding academic registration and campus life. Your attendance is mandatory. You will also go to Toyooka City Hall to complete necessary procedures such as resident registration. A university staff member will accompany you to assist with the procedures.</p>
<b>Cultural Exchange Opportunities</b>	<p>Our university offers a buddy program in which Japanese students support international students. The Center for Cross Culture also regularly hosts events that facilitate interaction between Japanese students and international students. Additionally, for those who are interested, there is a program that provides opportunities to engage with local families living in Toyooka.</p>
